

PARKING in a BAY

To reverse the car, with the most efficient steering, into one of a row of parking bays marked with white lines, such as found in supermarket car parks



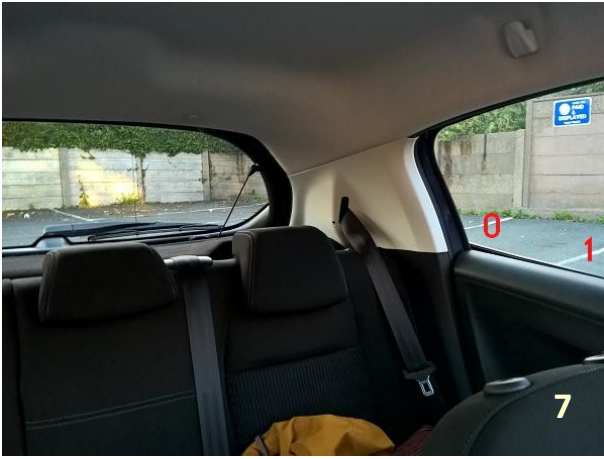
- 1 Stop **parallel** to ends of bays, **wheel straight**, ends in **bottom left of windscreen**
- 2 Consider unbuckling seatbelt (to make all-round observation easier)



- 3 **Choose the bay** to park in [e.g. the one with the blue sign behind it] ...
... and **number the bay lines**, from 1 (nearest side of it) to 3 (nearest to you)
- 4 Look all round. If safe, creep back, keeping **wheel straight** and **looking back** ...
... until **line 3 gets 1/3** along the passenger's door



- 5 Check over **right shoulder** ("blind spot") for anyone approaching, then ...
- 6 ... steer **full lock left**



- 7 Creep back, looking mainly through the **rear windscreen** ...
 8 ... but glancing around for anyone approaching (you'll need to give way)



- 9 When **line 0** appears in the right door mirror ...
 10 ... start to **gently undo the steering** (so, turn wheel to the right)



- 11 Get **wheel straight** once car is **parallel and evenly spaced** between lines 0 and 1
 12 Stop creeping back and secure car, when **end of bay lines reach door mirrors**

REMEMBER: if anyone is affected by you reversing, wait !
ALSO REMEMBER: look mainly through the rear windscreen while reversing !
